WALL PLAQUE PRICE REDUCTION

The Alumni Wall in front of the main building already contains several plaques that have been sponsored by various classes, listing their members and date of graduation. GAAA treasurer Ken Trobaugh recommended to the board that, since we have repaid the school for construction of the wall, we can reduce the price of space on the wall. The board approved the reduced fee of \$700 per foot of width. (This does not include the cost of the plaque.) We hope other classes will participate in this lasting commemoration – and perhaps families who have had multiple generations graduate from our alma mater.

The wall construction also included a section running down the east side of the main building, as part of Memorial Plaza. For those who wish to sponsor a plaque as a lasting remembrance of a student or staff member who died while at Glynn Academy, space on this Memorial Wall is available for a fixed fee of \$1000 for a space 15" high by 12" wide.

Glynn Academy senior named county STAR student

Jonah Driggers, a senior at Glynn Academy, was named the STAR student for Glynn County by the Professional Association of Georgia Educators (PAGE) Foundation. The Student Teacher Achievement Recognition (STAR) program honors Georgia's outstanding high school seniors and the teachers who have been most instrumental in their academic development. Every accredited high school in Georgia is eligible to participate in the STAR program. To obtain the STAR nomination for his or her school system, a high school senior must have the highest score on the three-part SAT and be in the top 10 percent or top 10 students of their class based on grade point average. Each high school STAR Student is asked to name his or her STAR Teacher. Jonah selected Andrea Walters, his 10th-grade honors American literature teacher. The Glynn County Board of Education recognized Jonah and Ms. Walters at its April 16 board meeting.



Glynn Academy football signing class grows by four

Four more Glynn Academy football players put pen to paper and signed letters of intent to play college football at the schools of their choice in a ceremony in the school's auditorium.

The moment was especially big for Glynn linebacker Cannon Thomas, who signed to play at University of Pikeville in Kentucky.

"I'm the first one out of my mom's children to go to college, so it feels real good," Thomas said. "It's a big step for my family. It's a blessing."

Thomas was joined on stage by defensive lineman E.J. Booker, who will join his teammate at Pikeville, C.J. Welch, who signed to play at Mississippi Delta Community College and quarterback Preston Delaney, who is headed to play at Huntington College in Montgomery, Ala. The group joins Jonathan Alford and Roby Jernigan, who signed with Fort Scott Community College and Berry College, respectively, on National Signing Day in February.

Booker said having Thomas join him in Pikeville, and NAIA school, adds to the excitement of going to college. "That's even better because most college players don't get their teammates to go to college with them," Booker said. "I'm blessed by that, too."

Thomas led the Glynn Academy defense with 93 tackles, including 83 solo tackles, with one sack, on forced fumble and one fumble recovery in his final season. Booker had 70 total tackles, including 48 solo tackles, to go with four sacks, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and an interception.


"It feels good," Booker said of signing his letter of intent. "It's a dream come true."

Both said they are expecting to deal with some cold weather when fall rolls around. Booker hasn't decided on a major course of study yet, but Thomas is already eyeing his future career.

His longest return was for 83 yards vs. Mercer that year, when he was the second leading scorer in the Southeastern Conference. Team cantain as a senior, he had a 95-yard kickoff return against South Carolina. Vassa also was SEC champion in the 100-yard teash (9.8) in '38, 220 low hurdles (23.8) in '39 and '40 (24.6). A Letter From The President...

Dear Fellow Alumni and Friends,

Our rich tradition and history at Glynn Academy continues stronger than ever. Glynn Academy holds the distinction of being the second oldest state chartered high school in Georgia and the fifth oldest in the nation. Founded in 1778, Glynn Academy predates both the oath of office of our first President, George Washington, and the ratification of the United States Constitution. In recognition of its state and national historic significance, Glynn Academy was successfully nominated and placed on the National Register of Historic Places by the Georgia National Register Review Board. An official marker was unveiled in February 2013.

The Glynn Academy Alumni Association has been an active part of this tradition since 1996 and now numbers more than 20,000 strong. For more than 15 years, the GA Alumni Association has generously supported projects that contribute to the continued success of Glynn Academy and its graduates. Among these efforts are the annual award of two \$500 college scholarships to outstanding GA graduates, library improvements, and contributions to athletic teams and the band, as well as to academic field trips that enhance the high school experience of GA students. An ambitious goal of the Association is the completion of the restoration of the white-columned 1840 school building that was relocated to the Glynn Academy campus in 2009. Over the past year, our fundraising efforts have focused, on initiating the interior restoration work needed to complete the historic Alumni Hall. Once open, the stately Alumni Hall will stand as a testament to the more than 230 years of dedication and pride of Glynn Academy alumni and faculty. Details on how to support the Alumni Hall restoration project and our many other efforts are profiled on the pages that follow.

I have spoken with Howard Mann, Superintendent of Schools, and Al Bordreau, Executive Director of Operations and they have assured me that the renovations of the Glynn Academy projects will be completed. I will continue to meet with them and keep everyone informed.

Thank you all for your continued support and interests in our beloved Alma Mater. A special thanks goes to the Class of 1963 for their contribution of \$630.00 to the Alumni Association for the restoration of Alumni Hall. I challenge each class to follow their lead. We will continue to raise money for that project, and hope you will be part of this effort.
